

THE LAW

Criminal law (Consolidation) (Scotland) Act 1995

If you are found in possession of a weapon in a public place you could face the following;

- Criminal record
- A fine
- Up to 4 years in prison

Police can and will search someone if they believe they are carrying a knife. With consent a pupil can be searched at school, if no consent is given Police Scotland are notified. If a pupil is found in possession of a weapon schools will record the incident and notify Police Scotland.

Any weapon/knife found will be confiscated.



WEAPONS

What is an offensive weapon?

An offensive weapon includes any article: made, adapted or intended for use to cause injury/harm.

Some examples include:-

Made

- Knuckle duster
- Swords



Adapted

- Metal comb with sharpened handle
- Baseball bat with nails in it

Intended

- Knife
- Golf club



There are NO Excuses for carrying a weapon/knife.

What Can YOU Do?

Have a chat with your child - they respect you more than you think. It can be a tricky conversation but start by asking them what they already know about weapon/knife crime.

Then remember to -

- Be a good listener
- Be positive
- Use facts not opinions
- Be patient/calm
- · Let them know they have a choice
- Let them know they can walk away from violence
- Encourage them to share their fears
