AFCCT Community Cup - Background



The AFCCT Community Cup will bring Primary Schools in the area, TAQA and AFCCT together. Participating in:

- Community initiatives
- ✓ Social action projects
- ✓ Sport with a focus on Fair-Play and sportsmanship

The schools will play a key role in their communities with social action projects. Through workshops, activities, ideas generated by the young people and the Fair-Play fixtures, the programme aims to connect pupils with their local community.

Running across the school year, regular newsletters will go out to the schools and TAQA with updates on activities and a league table of points culminating in a celebration event for all participants.

In line with TAQA's Vision for sustainability and low carbon Mission, the environment will be the key theme for the community and social action projects

The AFCCT Community Cup will engage TAQA in the local community, supporting education and promoting sustainable and low carbon aims to the next generation





Categories

Social Actions

For the duration of the programme, Schools will be awarded points for completing Social actions within their schools.

Social Actions are judged as actions completed within the school that educate pupils on current affairs in today's world.

Examples;

- Environmental awareness
- Anti-Bullying campaigns
- Healthy Eating initiatives
- Mental wellbeing awareness

Community Actions

Community actions are classed as an action carried out by the School that makes a positive contribution towards the Schools wider Community.

Examples;

- Community litter pick
- Visit to a local care home
- Host a community event at school
- Raise money for a charity cause
- Raise awareness on road safety

Workshops

AFCCT will deliver a minimum of 3 workshops per term for term 3 & 4. Each workshop will be targeted at the Community Cup committee or a selected group within each school dependant on each workshop.

Examples of potential workshops;

- Design a Logo & Trophy
- Positive Planet workshop
- One Stop Waste Recycling Workshop
- Police Scotland Cyber awareness





Fair Play Fixtures

In term 4 the Community Cup Fair Play Football Fixtures will commence. These will be fixtures will be played by all of the Community Cup schools competing against each other in a 7v7 format (Rules will be attached in due course).

Each school will create 2 teams of 10 pupils. 1 team will consist of P4 & P5 pupils, the other will consist of P6 & P7 Pupils.

Schools are allowed to take spectators and will gain extra points for actions such as posters supporting both the home and visiting teams, walking to away fixtures and many more.

A fixture list will be published by the AFCCT Community Cup coordinator detailing times and venues.







Scoring System

Each School are responsible for submitting any actions completed on the Microsoft Community Cup Actions Log form. The main point of contact MUST also email photo evidence of each action being completed for the points to be awarded (All photos submitted must only include children with photo consent to allow AFCCT to share). AFCCT reserves the right to accept and decline actions submitted by each School and judge the number of points awarded.

The AFCCT project lead will post a monthly newsletter that will go to the schools, TAQA and AFCCT showing the great work the schools are doing along with the league table.


Please an example of the points system below (Please note that schools will only get points once per term for an activity they repeat);

Social Action – 5 points maximum for each action completed (points depend on originality, difficulty and Impact).

Community Actions — Maximum of 20 points can be awarded for each action (points depend on originality, impact and number of participants).

Workshops — Maximum of 20 points can be awarded per workshop (points are awarded based on schools' engagement within each activity).

Social Media - Maximum of 5 points can be awarded per social media post published by the school (Screenshots of the post must also be sent to the Community Cup Coordinator).

- Have 1 member of staff to be the main contact that will control and receive all AFCCT Community Cup submissions, updates and information
- Drive the AFCCT Community Cup throughout the School by promoting positive messages and increase overall league position
